SEASONS IN STATION SQUARE Every season is marked by a change in plantings in the Square. As winter recedes, we begin to see the first daffodil shoots along the sidewalk under the LIRR station. Then the warmth of the Spring sun encourages our flowering shrubs on the embankment to bloom and allows us to plant pansies outside the Inn. When all danger of frost is over and summer beckons, the rose and peony blooms burst forth and we can add a variety of annuals to the center beds – small at first, those alyssum, vinca, salvia and lantana plants gradually increase in size until the beds are overflowing with blooms by September. As temperatures drop, some of the annuals start to fade so we add "mums" and kale wherever the Square is looking bare. Just before the snow and freezing temperatures arrive we plant more daffodil bulbs, but eventually we must let nature take a rest during the winter months and wait for the whole cycle to begin again. Friends of Station Square (FOSS) is so grateful that community support has enabled us to repeat this cycle for over 30 years.









Work on the Long Island Rail Road Station

Early in 2024 FOSS attended presentations from the LIRR along with the Forest Hills Gardens Corporation to discuss the work necessary to upgrade the station ramps to new government mandated standards. Compromises were met and work began in late Spring before grinding to a halt during the summer. When and if construction resumes, we will continue to advocate for it to be carried out in a manner sympathetic to our neighborhood.
